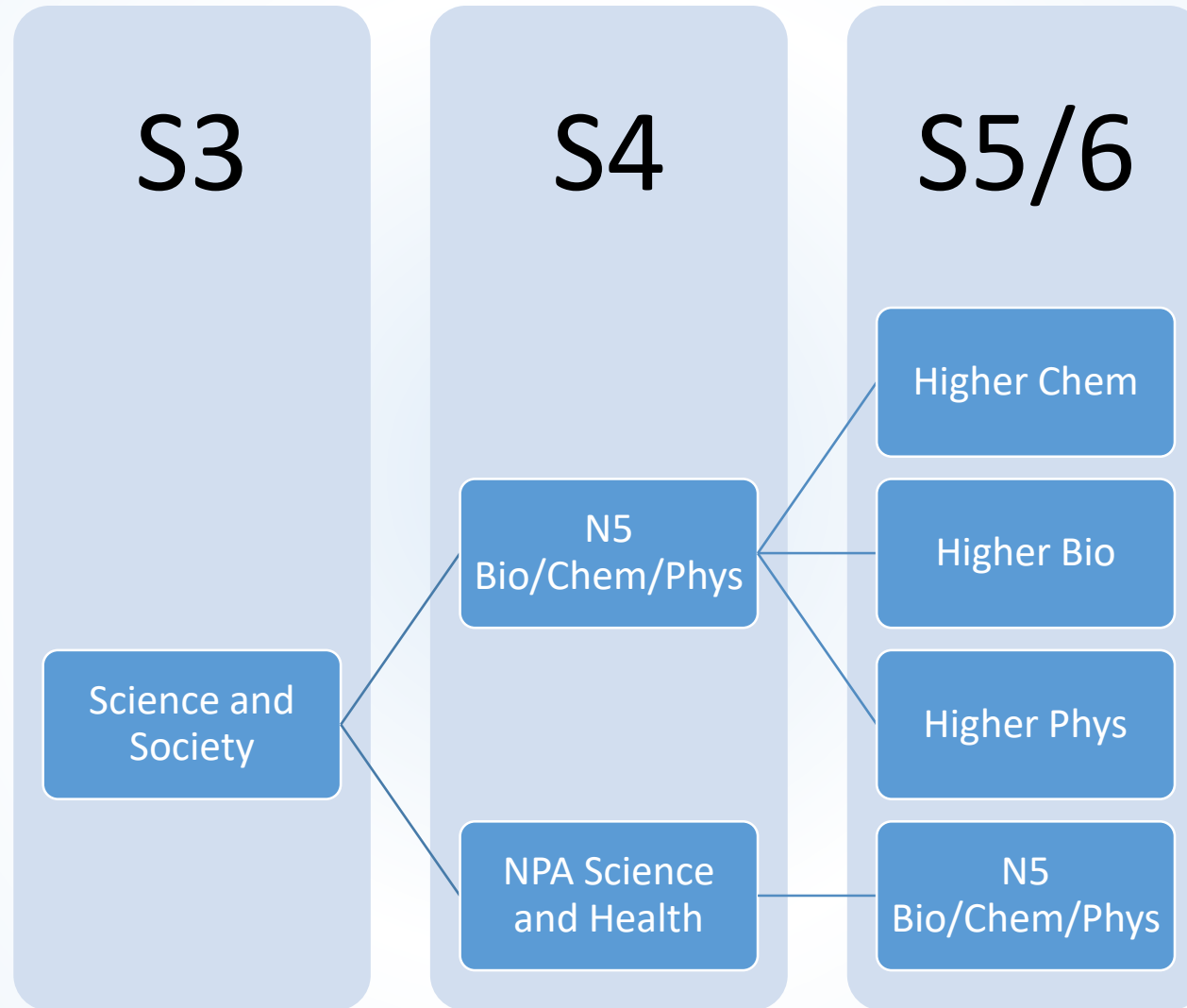

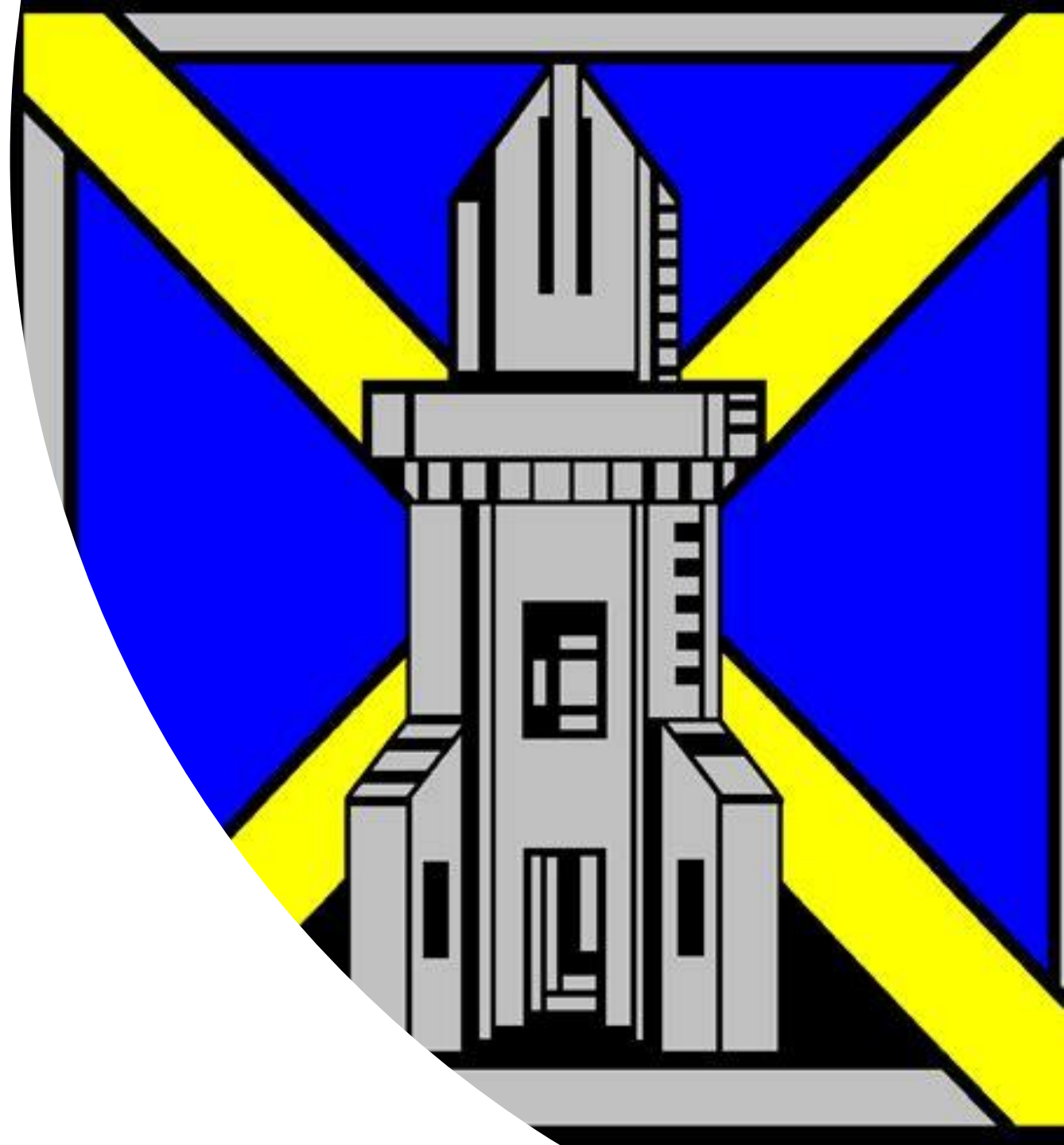
# Science and Society: Course Content

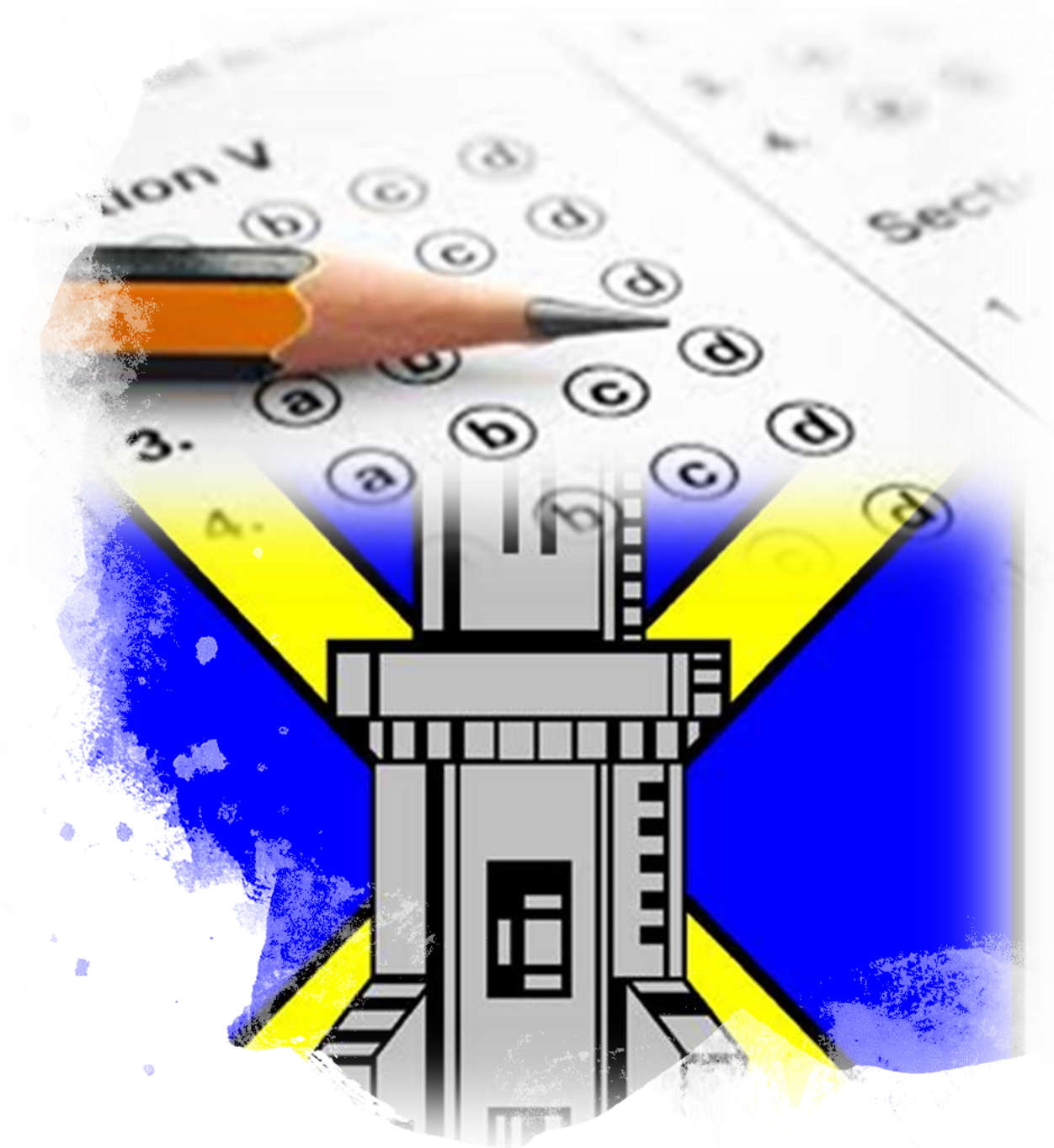
