# **ENGLISH**

On the occasion of World Poetry Day (7<sup>th</sup> October 2021), the English Faculty at Mearns Academy was privileged to host a digital workshop for Higher and Advanced Higher students entitled, 'Finding the Extraordinary in the Ordinary' which featured three poets of international repute - Dr. Alvin Pang from Singapore, Arundhathi Subramaniam from India and Fiona Bolger from Ireland in conversation with Shalini Pattabiraman on what inspires them to create poetry using everyday experiences and mundane objects.

The conversation explored a writer's process, their unique journey as a writer while sharing examples of their work and highlighting to the students on how they could similarly engage with ideas to stimulate their own writing. One of the things that came out of these conversations was the idea of how language even when it explores the most mundane or the most banal conversation, can be extremely political and a powerful tool to express extraordinary ideas.

This is one of the first in a series where we will be attempting to bring live literature closer to our students and giving them the tools for becoming expressive communicators. We hope to bring a diverse and eclectic range in the future and also welcome your thoughts on it.






# **SOCIAL SUBJECTS**

Pupils have been learning about Leonardo da Vinci. Pupils have been learning about tone and furthering their observational drawing skills.












# S2 ART AND DESIGN

Pupils have been working on their built environment unit. Pupils have been experimenting with different scales and learning how to use watercolour paint.















# S3 ART AND DESIGN
